How to Nominate

To nominate a candidate for the WGA Vendor of the Year Award, submit an explanation addressing all parts of the three points listed on the back of this form. It is important to provide complete answers to each question and to include as much information as possible. Add pages to this application to include newspaper clippings and articles if available, and include contact information for the nominee's family for additional information.

Examples of community service include, but are not limited to:

- Volunteer work on the town board with significant contributions.
- Volunteer work at the local food shelter or women's shelter.
- Leader in fundraiser for charity or good cause.
- Volunteer work at local schools.
- Volunteer firefighter or EMT.

Selection

The number of awards given in any specific year is at the discretion of the WGA Board. Directors will review candidates and determine the number of awards honored and vote on entries to determine honorees to be recognized.

Recognition

Winners will be notified in July, 2010 and will be featured in the Expo Issue of the Wisconsin Grocer magazine. A press release and media event will be scheduled in advance to announce the winners. A sign will also be provided to display in the store or office. A Community Service wall plaque will be presented September 22, 2010 during the Chairman's Banquet at the Hilton City Center Hotel in Milwaukee.

Nominations are due Friday, May 14, 2010.
