WISCONSIN GROCERS ASSOCIATION: THE GREAT WISCONSIN BAG-OFF COMPETITION



This is the Wisconsin version of the NGA's Best Bagger competition for our WGA Members. This packet is to help you host your own Best Bagger Competition. It will help you determine who will represent your store at The Great Wisconsin Bag-Off Competiton, and hopefully the NGA Best Bagger Championship.

After the completion, remember to contact Lauren Barnes at the WGA to register your winner. *The deadline to register for The Great Wisconsin Bag off is October 6th, 2023.*

Objectives

The purpose of The Great Wisconsin Bag-Off:

- Encourage the teaching and development of the knowledge and skills of successful bagging;
- Promote good organization, fair competition, and good sportsmanship through friendly competition;
- Incorporate customer service knowledge and skills into the learning experience of the retail grocery industry.



- Primary duties must be 40% (approximately) a bagger
- Non-managerial role
- WGA allows more than one bagger from a company

Judging Criteria

- Speed
- Proper bag building technique
- Style, attitude, and appearance
- Number of bags used
- Uniform bag weight

In the event of a tie, run a tie-breaker round.





- A whistle will sound and the bagger will start packing everything into bags.
- Once finished, the baggers must clap their hands above their head. This is key. The timers will only stop once they have clapped their hands.
- Remind baggers to keep going until they finish. A bagger may be second in their flight, but could be in the top three after the scoring takes place.
- Bagging generally takes about 50 – 90 seconds to complete. Judging and reset take closer to 5-10 minutes, so plan accordingly.

Each store can send one person to The Great Wisconsin Bag-Off Competiton. If your store only has one person who wants to compete, you do not have to host a Best Bagger Competition.

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What do you need to hold a Best Bagger Competition at your store?*



- Scale (to weigh bags)

 You MUST use reusable bags per the rules from the NGA
- Aprons (store uniforms)
- Pens (for judging)
- Score sheets (provided below)
- Calculator
- Stop watches

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Volunteer Duties

Judges

Judges must be fair, consistent, and impartial. An ideal candidate might be someone who has bagging experience. The Great Wisconsin Bag-Off has 4 Judges - one judge (and timer) for each check stand, plus one Official/ Scorekeeper Judge. You can have as many judges as you need. Look to the right for more information on what the judging categories are.

DUTIES OF AN OFFICIAL/SCOREKEEPER JUDGE ARE:

- 1. Fill out a score sheet for each bagger and place it at the check stand prior to the beginning of each heat.
- 2. Add up the total of points on the score sheet after the Judge turns them in and check the scores with the other judges.



You need to have one timer per check stand. Timers are responsible for keeping time of each heat and are able to help re-set the groceries on the check stands. Timers may also help the Bag Mover, if requested.

DUTIES OF A TIMER ARE:

- 1. Timers start the stopwatch when the M.C. gives the command.
- 2. Timers stop the stopwatch when the contestant has clapped his/her hands above their head.
- 3. When the heat is completed, the timer writes down the baggers time on the score sheet then places it on top of one of the bags for the Judges.
- 4. When the heat is completed, the timer walks with the bags to the Judges.
- 5. Know which bags belong to which bagger.



One person per check stand to assist the Timer and Judges when it comes to re-setting the grocery order for the next heat.

DUTIES OF A STAGER ARE:

- 1. Help the **Bag Mover** remove the already weighed bags to a holding area for easier access of the grocery order to prepare them for re-setting.
- 2. Re-set the grocery order before each heat.
- 3. Exchange any damaged groceries as needed in the grocery order before each heat.
- 4. Assist the timers and judges if they need it in calculating the score.







Weigh each bag on the scale provided and write down the weight of each bag on the score sheet before handing the completed score sheet to the scorekeeper.



Bag Build: Complete the bagging technique section on the score sheet.



Style, Attitude & Appearance:

Appearance, demeanor, style (anything that stands out in a positive way).



Official Scorekeeper: Scorekeepers are

responsible for assisting the judges with tallying up the final scores.
